For the 2008-09 school year, 29 students at Greendale High School taking AP exams have been named AP scholars by the College Board.

- 14 students were named AP Scholars receiving 3.0 on three or more exams.
- 3 students were named AP Scholar with Honor for earning an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP exams and grades of 3 or higher on four or more exams.
- 10 students were named AP Scholar with Distinction for earning an average grade of 3.5 on all AP exams taken and grades of 3 or higher on at least five exams.
- 2 students were named National AP Scholar receiving an average grade of at least 4 on all AP exams taken and grades of 4 or higher on eight or more of these exams.

Continuing a long tradition of excellence, the Class of 2009 had two National Merit Scholarship Commended Students and four Finalists. This class received over 1.8 million dollars in scholarships and awards.
