**SOUTHWESTERN MILWAUKEE COUNTY HEALTH  
DEPARTMENTS SCHEDULE H1N1 INFLUENZA CLINICS**  
*All clinics open to the general public*

**Greendale, Wis.** — Building upon regional planning efforts that began in August, the four health departments representing southwestern Milwaukee County (Franklin, Greendale, Greenfield, and Hales Corners) have scheduled two large-scale Saturday clinics for their residents in December. These clinics are intended for individuals of all ages, with a preference for those in the current Wisconsin Division of Public Health target groups (as of 11/24/09):

- **Pregnant women**
- **Household contacts of children less than 6 months**
- **Healthcare and emergency medical response workers with direct patient contact**
- **Children between 6 months – 24 years old**
- **Adults between 25 – 64 years with chronic medical conditions**

Collectively, the four health departments have both intranasal and injectable H1N1 Influenza vaccines in adequate supply to meet the anticipated demand. The type of vaccine will be allocated based on each individual's age, health risk factors, and medical condition(s). The H1N1 vaccination is available free of charge and will be provided on a first come, first serve basis. Individuals planning to attend these clinics should understand that demand for the H1N1 Influenza vaccine is high. Therefore, clinic attendees should anticipate the potential for long lines and we ask for your patience and understanding.

The clinics are scheduled for the following dates and times:

- **Greenfield City Hall**, 7325 W. Forest Home Ave., Greenfield (use South entrance)  
**Saturday, December 5 from 10:00 am – 2:00 pm**
- **Franklin City Hall**, 9229 W. Loomis Rd., Franklin (use north entrance at front of City Hall)  
**Saturday, December 19 from 9:00 am – 3:00 pm**

Additionally, the four health departments will be hosting other H1N1 Influenza vaccination clinics during December. Information can also be found on the respective city website or by contacting 2-1-1 Wisconsin. Greendale will have additional local clinics in December open to all ages.
